Summer Classes

Our Summer block of Bible classes began last week. We encourage everyone to take advantage of these opportunities for growth and learning.

Inside Out: A Church for the Community - taught by Kyle Sapp in room 101. We will explore and engage ways we can bring the love of Jesus to the Sacramento area.

Big Idea: This week we explored three ideas: 1) Sex is a covenant good from God that expresses life and love. 2) Lust treats sex as a consumer good. 3) We explored the virtue of chastity.

Read Romans 7:14-20

1) What is Paul saying about human nature in this passage?

a) How is lust an expression of weakness and slavery?

b) What are small ways lust is present in people's lives?

Read Genesis 1:27-28; Gen. 2:23-24

2) How is sex an expression of life and love?

a) In what ways is covenant an important element for a healthy sexual experience?

Read Matthew 5:27-30

3) How does lust turn sex into a consumer good?

a) What is the difference between a covenant good and a consumer good?

b) What do you take away from Jesus' teachings on adultery?

c) Does Jesus really want people to cut off hands or lose eyes? What might Jesus actually be telling us in this passage?

Read Romans 8:1-8

4) How does this passage help us understand the virtue of Chastity? How does Chastity bring freedom?

5) The sermon suggested that pursuing the fruit of the Spirit will help us have chaste hearts. Do you agree? Explain

6) Why is shame a common experience for people who struggle with lust?

a) How can fostering authentic communities bring people out of shame and into freedom?

7) Lust is about the eyes as much as it is about the heart. What can you do to keep your eyes from looking in sinful and unhealthy directions?

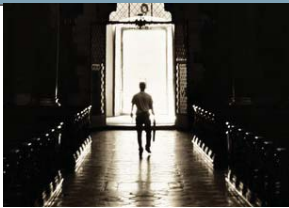

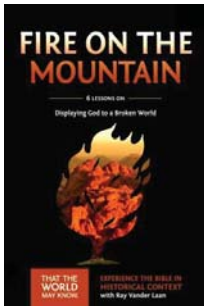
